WHAT TO DO IF YOU SMELL GAS

What to Do

- 1. Leave the Area: Exit the building or area immediately.
- Don't Use Electronics or Phones: Do not use or operate any electrical switches or phones, including cell phones, in the area of the leak.
- 3. Don't Light Flames: Do not smoke, light matches, or use lighters.
- 4. Call from a Safe Location: Once you are a safe distance away, call <u>Enbridge Gas at</u> 1-866-763-5427 or 911.
- Never Re-enter: Do not go back inside the building until it has been inspected and declared safe by emergency services.
- 6. Inform HOTT staff via our emergency line at 647-296-4688.

Signs of a Gas Leak

- Smell: A distinct rotten egg or sulphur-like odour.
- Sound: A hissing or whistling noise.
